

## **INTERNATIONAL TEACHING FELLOWSHIPS – CHINA**

### **DESCRIPTION**

In 2007, the Piper Center for Creative Writing established a partnership with Sichuan University in Chengdu, China. This program offers a bi-lingual experience exploring how and whether creativity can be translated from Chinese to English. For Summer 2010 – May 13-June 11 – four fellowships are available to support the teaching of creative writing to faculty, undergraduate and graduate students at Sichuan University. Students will teach workshops and assist faculty and students with their online literary journal.

### **WHO CAN APPLY**

All currently enrolled MFA students in creative writing are eligible to apply.

### **AWARD AMOUNT**

\$2,000 Piper Global Fellowship

(amount subject to change based on current airfare prices and estimated costs) to cover airfare; Sichuan University will provide transportation, some tourism costs, and meals. All costs that exceed the fellowship amount will be at the student's expense. This fellowship is not intended to cover 100% of costs. Visa, passport, and immunization fees will be at the student's expense.

### **SPECIAL COMMITMENTS**

Within thirty days of returning from fellowship commitments, students will need to submit an essay about their international fellowship experience and a program evaluation. Late responses will render students ineligible for future fellowships.

All fellowship applicants and awardees are encouraged to take the Spring course, Gateway to Global Engagement.
