¹ BIO156 or BIO160 will be accepted in lieu of ASU BIO201 for ATP students provided the course satisfies the SG requirement according to the CEG (Course Equivalency Guide) in effect at the time the course is taken.

² Applicants for the social work major must have a minimum of 240 hours of work or volunteer experience in a social work related setting. SWU 291 includes a component of 40 volunteer hours, which may be applied to the 240 hour requirement.

³ Transferable as lower division only. Students must still meet the 45 hour requirement for upper division hours.

⁴ Students are encouraged to select an [HU] course that concurrently satisfies the [G] requirement if [G] is not met by a Non-English Language.

⁵ This requirement may be satisfied by certified proficiency in any language, other than English, at the fourth semester level. The School of Social Work strongly encourages students to consider Spanish or a Tribal language. Completion of a course that transfers to ASU as equivalent to SHS 202 American Sign language IV will fulfill the language requirement but does not carry the [G] general studies designation. Students will need to select an alternative course to fulfill the [G] requirement.

⁶ ASU College of Public Programs Requirements for communication, computer and writing competency courses (9 hours) required in the ASU 06-07 Catalogue will be waived by petition for students completing the MCCCD 06/07 ATP. ATP students are still required to satisfy all university general studies requirements.
