 - completion of a language course at the intermediate level (202 or equivalent), including American Sign Language IV; or
 - completion of upper division course(s) taught in a foreign language, taken in the United States or the relevant country (contact college advisors for information on individual majors); or
 - completion of six hours of upper division courses that have a Global Awareness (G) or Cultural Diversity in the U.S. (C) designation, in addition to the courses used to meet the University General Studies requirements; or
 - completion of two sequential semesters of course work in a current computer language (contact academic advisors for information on individual majors).
